Monday, Sept. 9: Departure

We depart Chicago O'Hare today for our overnight flight. Sit back and enjoy the in-flight entertainment.

Tuesday, Sept. 10: Croatia - Arrive in

Upon arrival in Zagreb, Croatia's largest city, you will be met and transferred to your hotel. The rest of the afternoon is at leisure. Dinner is included at the hotel; overnight in Zagreb. (D)

Wednesday, Sept. 11: Croatia - Zagreb

Today we enjoy a guided walking tour of the city. We will visit the main square and then tour the impressive Neo-Gothic Zagreb Cathedral before enjoying the unique experience of the Dolac Market. Croatia's largest farmers market. The market usually closes around 3 PM, so be sure to explore while the market is still in full operation. If it is open today, we will pay a short visit to Gric Tunnel, a WWII bomb shelter and evacuation tunnel that has been remodeled into a historical display of Croatia and Zagreb. Taking a ride on the world's shortest funicular, we arrive in the medieval Upper Town of the city where our tour takes us to the Lotrscak Tower, the Strossmayer promenade, the Croatian Parliament and St. Mark's Church with its eye-catching colorful roof. Dinner will be

on your own tonight; Tkalciceva Street, known for its varied restaurants, pubs and cafes, may be a good place to explore for dinner. Overnight in Zagreb.

Thursday, Sept. 12: Croatia - Plitvice **Lakes National Park**

After breakfast we travel to the Plitvice Lakes National Park which is the oldest national park in southeast Europe and the largest national park in Croatia. The national park is world famous for its lakes arranged in cascades and spectacular waterfalls. It is a Unesco World Heritage site. We will spend the evening at a nearby hotel, allowing some time for relaxation and dinner, included in our stay. Overnight in the national park. (B,D)

Friday, Sept. 13: Croatia - Zadar, Sibenik, Split

This afternoon we will travel to Zadar, a beautiful Adriatic town on the Dalmatian coast and home of an unusual instrument, a sea organ. The Sea Organ is a set of marble steps with special tubes located underneath; the waves rolling in create a very unique concert for visitors. Zadar is a quieter city away from the heavier crowds of some other locations. It's early history dates back to ancient Rome, and our guide will take us to the ancient Roman Forum to see the city's Old Town. At the waterfront, ruins can


the city in the 6th century. Continuing south along the coast, we enjoy a brief stop in Sibenik, known as a gateway to the Kornati Islands, before arriving in the town of Split where we will have dinner and overnight. (B,D)

Saturday, Sept. 14: Croatia - Split

This morning we enjoy a guided tour of the city: Split grew up under Emperor Diocletian's vast Roman palace, one of the largest and best-preserved left from the Roman world. The building of this vast complex began in 284 A.D. The Old Town is located in the same area as the palace, and a number of cafes, shops and restaurants can be found on Narodni Trg (People's Square). This afternoon is free to relax, explore the city, enjoy the beach and get dinner on our own. The Riva Promenade is a lovely waterfront walk along the harbor and a great place to watch the sun set. We will overnight in Split. (B)

Sunday, Sept. 15: Bosnia and Herzegovina - Krevice Falls, Mostar

This morning we will take our bus into nearby Bosnia and Herzegovina, stopping at the stunning Krevice Falls. While it will probably be a bit chilly for swimming this time of year, we can still get our feet wet in the beautiful blue-green waters below the falls before continuing on to famous Mostar. This city was on the trade route between the Adriatic and mineral rich regions of central Bosnia.







The world-famous Old Bridge has recently been restored with many of the same stones as the original and is one of the city's more recognizable landmarks. The cobblestone streets of the Old Town are equally interesting. It is situated on the Neretva River and was named after the bridge keepers who in medieval times guarded the Stari Most (Old Bridge). We will have dinner and overnight in Mostar for the next two evenings. (B,D)

Monday, Sept. 16: Bosnia and Herzegovina - Sarajevo

Today we have 3 options: Your first option is to travel by bus to Sarajevo, the capital and largest city of Bosnia and Herzegovina, for a guided walking tour of this beautiful city. Here we will find a strong blend of various histories and peoples. From Bascarsija Square, a 15th century outdoor market, to World War I and the scene of Archduke Franz Ferdinand's assassination, this city has found itself in the center of many power struggles over the years. Following lunch on our own in the city center, we will return to Mostar for dinner on our own. Your second option is to remain in Mostar for a free day. The third option is on this free day you may take a bus to The Holy Shrine of Madjugorje, price not included in trip cost. It is about 17 miles from Mostar and bus cost is about \$4 each way. (B)

Tuesday, Sept. 17: Stolac, Dubrovnik After breakfast, we head towards the

Mediterranean coast once again. Stolac is a small but beautiful town dating back to ancient days. The area is well known for its lovely rivers, lakes and waterfalls. Our guide will take us to Radimlia Necropolis, an ancient cemetery known for its beautifully preserved tombstones from the 14th and 15th centuries. In the Old Town we will see the medieval streets and houses as we learn of the town's history and its part in the Ottoman

Empire. Enjoy lunch on our own before the journey south along the coast until we come to our final hotel in Dubrovnik. Any remaining time is free to explore on our own. Dinner will be at our Dubrovnik hotel, where we will spend the next three nights. (B.D)

Wednesday, Sept. 18: Croatia -**Dubrovnik**

This city is a jewel encased in city walls. It is set in the limpid waters of the Adriatic Sea. Dubrovnik is a top international tourist destination of Dalmatia. George Bernard Shaw baptized Dubrovnik "the pearl of the Adriatic" because of its incomparable architectural heritage. The gleaming marble streets are lined with baroque buildings punctuated by beautifully sculpted Renaissance fountains and facades. Once it was a maritime republic rivaling Venice. A walking tour of the city will take us to the Old Town's Franciscan Monastery, the Stradun monument, Onofrio's Fountain, the Rector's Palace. the Sponza Palace and the Cathedral of the Assumption. After lunch on our own, we will enjoy getting a unique perspective of the city and its situation on the coast by taking a historical walking tour along its ancient walls. We will be on our own for dinner this evening. Overnight in Dubrovnik. (B)

Thursday, Sept. 19: Croatia - Dubrovnik (Free Day, Optional Elaphite Islands **Cruise Excursion**)

Today is free for relaxing, shopping and exploring on our own. An optional excursion will be offered for those who wish to do some more guided sightseeing. Further details will be forthcoming, but the tentative plan is for a cruise of the Elaphite Islands, possibly including a meal aboard the cruise.

Friday, Sept. 20: Home

We transfer to the airport in Dubrovnik this morning and fly home. (B)
